






WHERE TIJP BEGAN

This is Jane Project began in 2019 as a photo-activism campaign to destigmatize conversations around trauma, healing, and medicating with cannabis. After photographing more than 50 women and non-binary trauma survivors, we realized that TIJP needed to be more than media and thus, This is Jane Project 501c3 was born. Now, we offer robust trauma-informed programming to support our growing community of Janes while continuing to document stories of hope and healing from trauma.



WHERE ARE WE NOW

We have come a long way since 2019. Now, as a federally recognized 501c3, we offer robust trauma-informed programming such as virtual and in-person healing-centered events and access to low-to-no-cost medicinal cannabis and other legal psychedelics. And we are just getting started!

Having served roughly 2.8k Janes, we have made a significant impact on the lives of survivors. However, we have merely touched the tip of the iceberg. For us to keep up with our 65% growth rate, we need additional funding, staff, and product to continue helping Jane heal.





HELPING JANES HEAL - HHH

Healing Happy Hour (HHH) is a monthly, virtual, free event that brings Janes together to explore a wide spectrum of traumainformed healing modalities and share stories about their healing with these modalities. Because there is no one type of trauma, there is no one-size-fits-all path toward healing.

- \$10,000 = Year Virtual Program Support (12 events)
- \$1,000 = Back end Production Cost (Zoom + Hardware)
- \$200 = Facilitator (Per Event)

- \$75 \$150 = Emotional Support Life Coach (Per Event)
- \$50 \$100 = Raffle/Prize (Per event)
- Production Manager (Part Time- Full Time)

HELPING JANES HEAL - HEARTS

HEARTs (Healing Arts) are quarterly, virtual, free, artist-led community events using creative mediums like drawing, painting, and coloring with a group-led discussion on a healing topic. HEARTs seeks to provide women and non-binary trauma survivors with artistic healing tools for their toolkits.

- \$7,500 = Year Virtual Program Support (4 events)
- \$1,000 = Back end Production Cost (Zoom + Hardware)
- \$250 = Art Facilitator (Per Event)

- \$400 \$1600 = Art Supplies (Single to Year)
- \$300 \$1200 = Shipping /Postage
- Art Life Coach (Part Time- Full Time)

HELPING JANES HEAL - DAY OF HEALING

Day of Healings are in-person trauma informed healing focused events organized to provide a nurturing space for 30-60 Janes, where they can learn about powerful practice or specific healing modality for improving their mental well-being, while incorporating consumption friendly, TIJP photo activism activity, and community storytelling with the event.

- \$10,000 = Year Program Support (6 events)
- \$1,600 = 1 Event (Including Space)
- \$250 = Facilitator (Per Event)

- \$250= Water & Snacks for 3-60 Janes
- \$500 = For Photographer
- \$1500 = LiveStream the event
