EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR STATEMENT

2022 was a year full of growth and transformation for This is Jane Project. In just our second year as a 501c3, we supported hundreds of Janes on their journey to healing. We held space, provided access points, and created art for a year full of shedding light, providing community, and uplifting the lives of women and non-binary trauma survivors.

In 2022 This is Jane Project hosted:

- 12 Healing Happy Hours
- 8 Survivor's Without Access Compassion
- 3 HEARTS Healing Art Hours
- 3 Community Outreach Events

Every month, we gathered together to hear from various healing practitioners for our **Healing Happy Hour** program. We hosted 8 compassion events in Los Angeles and Denver, supporting hundreds of Janes with compliant, tested cannabis through our **Survivor's Without Access** Program.

We also hosted 3 **HEARTs Healing Art** hours, where Janes came together to be led by an artist through a healing art medium. Further, TIJP had the honor of bringing events to Detroit, MI and Phoenix, AZ through our newest **Community Outreach program**.

We're also honored to have been recognized by the LA Times, The Green Room with Eaze and Weed for Warriors Project for our SB-34 Compassion work. We've expanded our Board of Directors to include professional volunteers who are committed to our mission.

Additionally, we curated a Culturally-Informed Resource Guide for mental health professionals that will be published on our website this month! Further, we are overjoyed to announce that we are launching our newest program, Finding Jane, which facilitates affordable access to legal and reliable psychedelic treatments for addressing anxiety, depression, and self-discovery. We have much to look forward to in 2023 and with your tax-deductible donation, we can continue to shed light, build community, and uplift the lives of survivors.



Please join us for these FREE events on the 4th Wednesday of each month.










2022 HEARTS HEALING ARTS IMPACT
