EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR STATEMENT

With over 500 new Janes across 6 cities finding community, connection, and access to medicine and modalities for healing, 2024 was all about expansion, education and resilience for TJP.

While some may not fully grasp the depth and breadth of This is Jane Project's work, those we serve—and our allies—do. They understand the importance of reliable, survivor-centered programming like our monthly Healing Happy Hours and quarterly HEARTs Healing Arts events. They recognize the therapeutic benefits of cannabis, the barriers to safe and affordable access for those who need it most, and the critical role of programs like Survivors Without Access (SWA) in addressing these challenges.

As we look ahead to 2025, I must first recognize the contributions of those aligned with our mission to shed light, build community, and uplift the lives of women and non-binary trauma survivors. To all those who supported this transformative work: thank you.

Without partnerships with Wana Brands Foundation, Rooted in Good, PAX, EventHi, Blunt Brunch, MJ BizCon, GRRRL Music, Leafwell, Canna Content, Nancy Chains, Club Kindness, PotCo, Canna Cabana Bus, Native Roots, Gorilla Rx Wellness, ReCompass, and Baked by the River, none of the work I am honored to report on this year would have been possible.

The impact made by TIJP is also due to the relentless efforts of our staff, volunteers, and Board members. Your selfless contributions are part of what makes TIJP unique. As an organization run by and for trauma survivors, we embrace the messiness of healing because we know there is magic in shared vision and commitment. Thank you for being part of that magic.

Through partnerships with organizations like The Social Impact Center, 1937 Foundation, Illinois Women in Cannabis, & The Blue Bench, we co-hosted community-building events that fostered healing through education, advocacy, and storytelling.

To the brands who donated regulated products to support SWA in 2024, thank you. In closing – to speak truth to the messiness mentioned above. 2024 was also a year of resilience despite obstacles for TIJP. Learning we were not compliant with the Attorney General's office in our home state of California in Q3 forced us to pause all operations in CA, impacting the lives of Los Angeles Janes w/ the loss of access via LA SWA. We continue to work diligently to bring this necessary program back to California.

For too long society has swept experiences of womenand non-binary people— to the margins. We, too, experience trauma at alarming and disproportionate rates yet little is discussed about the efficacy of cannabis in treating everyday symptoms of PTSD for nonveterans. TIJP is having that discussion. Join us in elevating the message of TIJP— that no Jane, regardless of socioeconomic status, location, age, gender presentation, ethnicity, or religious beliefs, need go without access to proven medicine and modalities often referred to as "non-traditional". As we look ahead to 2025, I invite you to join us in this transformative work. Whether as a Jane, or as an ally— the revolution is trauma-informed.


2024 HEALING HAPPY HOUR-IMPACT
